

Llama Quilt Foundation Paper Piecing

Fabric Suggestions...

- 4 fat quarters in llama body tones.
- 1 fat quarter for llama face
- 3 fat quarters for saddle
- Scraps of black for hooves, nose and eyes.
- 1 meter of background fabric

Approx finished size:

- 1 meter square

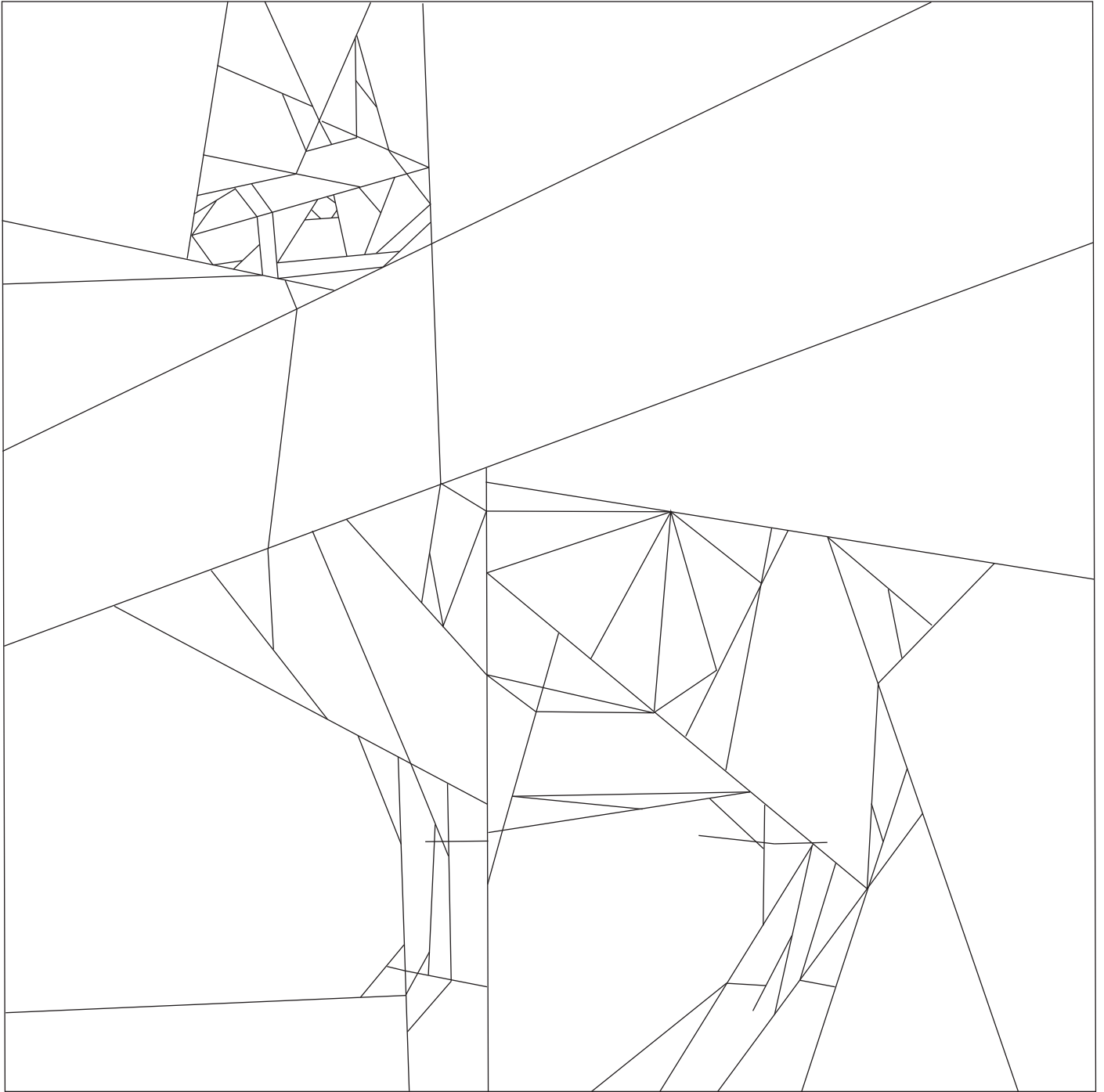
Printing...

Print the pattern pieces at “actual size” on A4 paper to ensure the finished size is as stated. These will then tape together by butting up the edges of the paper together, where you can then use a ruler to connect any broken lines.

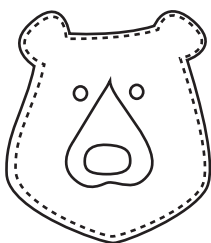
Piecing it together...

1. Take block A. Lay fabric piece A1 right side up on the template so that the fabric completely covers the section marked A1 with at least a 1/4” overlap all the way around (seam allowance). Put a pin in this to hold it in place.
2. Take fabric piece A2 and place it right sides together on A1 matching the raw edges where pieces A1 and A2 meet. Pin in place. (Check that once sewn and folded over A2 will completely cover its section with a 1/4” overlap all the way around).
3. Turn the template over so you are working on the reverse of the paper. I find I can easily see the line through the paper but if you can't either draw the line on with a pen or put the fabric on the reverse of the template and sew from the printed side. (This will produce a mirror image of the final design). Stitch along the line between A1 and A2, stitching through the paper and both layers of fabric. (Ensure you backstitch at the beginning and end of the line as it will need to be secure for when you remove the paper later on).
4. Open out and press.
5. Repeat these steps with the remaining pieces in block A to complete this block.
6. Trim the block down to the outer seam allowance line and tear off the paper.
7. Repeat these steps with all the other blocks.

8. Using the labelled plan as a guide attach the blocks in the following order (using whatever seam allowance you have trimmed to): A to B, to C, to D. E to F. ABCD to EF, to G, to H. to I, to J. K to L. N to O, to M, to KL. Q to R, to T, to U. P to S, to QRTU, To V, to W, to X. PQRSTUWW to X, to KLMNO, to J.

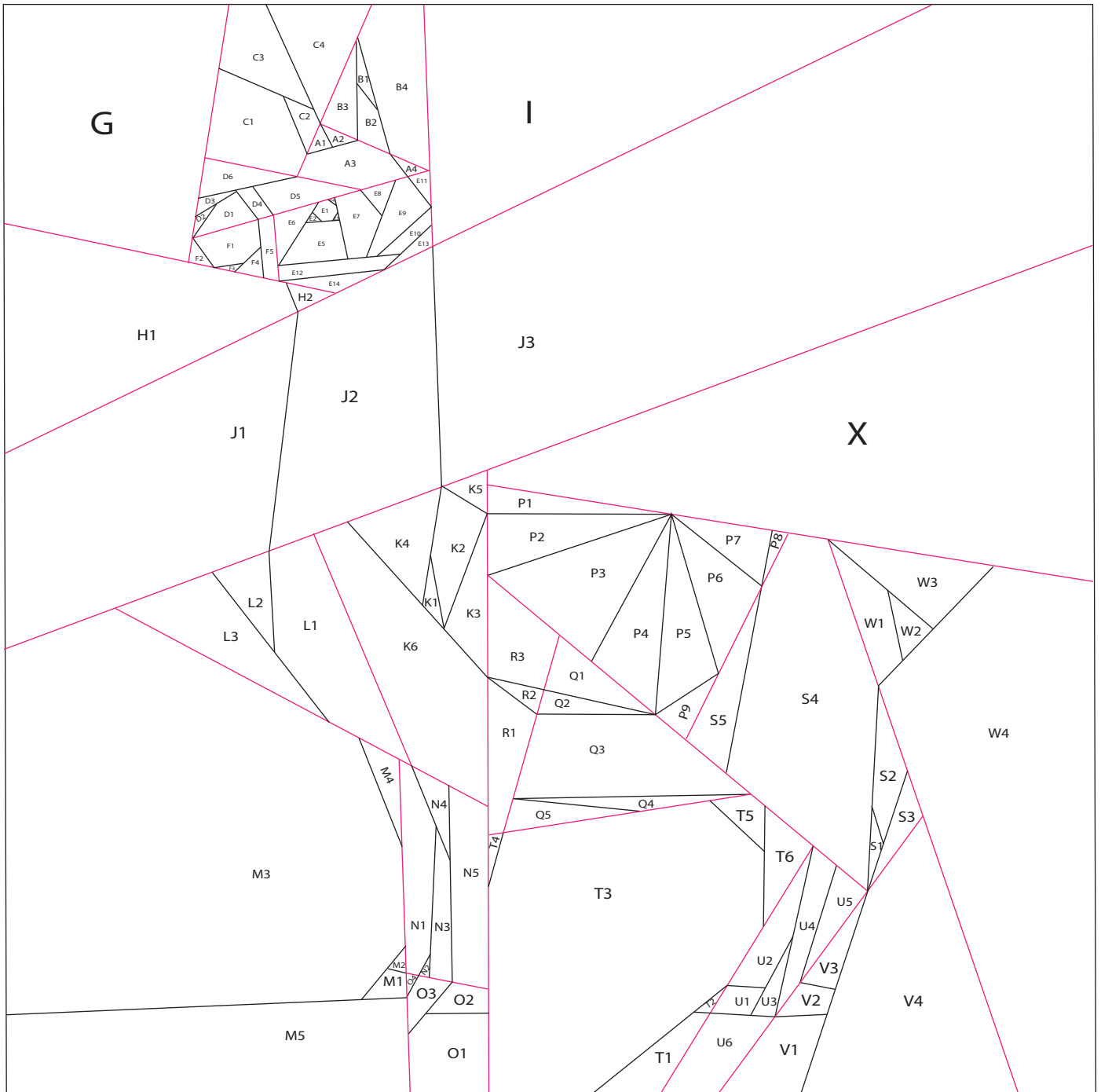


Colour this in to help you plan which fabric you want to use where
